### RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation to increase appropriations in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department by \$300, offset by the Eighth Council District One-Time District Priority Funds, transferred from the Citywide Activities Department, to provide a contribution to Black Employees Association of Long Beach to support their Black History Month Celebration on February 18, 2025; and

Decrease appropriations in the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department by \$300 to offset a transfer to the City Manager Department.

### DISCUSSION

The Black Employees Association hosted their Black History Month Celebration on February 18, 2025, from 3-5pm. This public event at city hall honored and celebrated the cultural achievements and historical legacy of the Black community. The event highlighted local talent and cultural food.

This recommendation has been reviewed by Budget Manager Rebecca Bernstorff on March 25, 2025.

### FISCAL IMPACT

This recommendation requests the City Manager to provide a contribution to Black Employees Association of Long Beach to support their Black History Month Celebration that was held on February 18, 2025. The total appropriation increase of


\$300 in the General Fund Group in the City Manager Department will be offset by a decrease of appropriation of Eighth Council District One-time District Priority Funds in

the General Fund Group in the Citywide Activities Department.
