# Director's Highlights

## Parks, Recreation, Marine and Animal Care Services

### May 2025 Highlights

1. Parks, Recreation, Marine and Animal Care Services team members are embracing the Month of May with the spirit of celebration...May is Older Americans Month, and our department will receive a proclamation for this notable month before City Council on Tuesday, May 13<sup>th</sup>. The first week of May, we honored our volunteers during Volunteer Appreciation Week, with special recognition for the scores of community-minded volunteers at Long Beach Animal Care Services along with the El Dorado Nature Center. Mother's Day weekend always sees an influx of celebratory gatherings across our park system and beachfront. Happy Older Americans Month and Happy Mother's Day!
2. Veterans Park and Council District 7 hosted an amazing Mariachi Festival on Saturday, May 3, 2025. A great community turnout filled the park's open spaces, and the patrons were treated with some of the top mariachi talent, including the headliner, Julian Torres, who became the first mariachi artist on Snoop Dogg's Death Row Records label. Julian performed at the Hollywood Bowl as well as the tribute to Kobe Bryant. Congratulations on what we hope to see becoming a great annual tradition for Veterans Park in the years to come.
3. The City of Long Beach has reached the mid-point of a 4-month, pilot project program of the Throne Smart restrooms, a contract service-based support of solar-powered portable restrooms. The user-friendly Q-R Code accessible restroom units were sited at Belmont Pier, Shoreline at the bikeway, DeForest Park, and Harvey Milk Park. To date, the department has received rave reviews from park and beachfront patrons, with (knock on wood), no reports of graffiti or vandalism. Identifying future funding to extend the pilot will be a determining factor if the Throne restrooms continue to occupy prime locations to better meet the needs of the community.
4. A sampling of some of the super engaging programs and events for Older Americans Month include: a Senior Safety Summit and Spring Craft Expo at Houghton Park, Movie Night featuring "Grease" at Cesar E. Chavez Park, a Pickleball Tournament at DeForest Park, a Sunset Rodeo Dance at Expo Center, the Silverado Carnival at Silverado Park, a Talent Show at McBride Park, and Club Rush at the Long Beach Senior Center on 4<sup>th</sup> Street.

5. Our department was saddened by the unexpected passing of Senior Animal Control Officer, Lieutenant Alfredo Magana. A long-time, dedicated team member at Long Beach Animal Care Services, Lieutenant Magana had led and trained animal control officers for nearly three decades. A tree will be planted in his memory on the grounds of LBACS in the coming weeks.
6. Major renovation work and facility upgrades for the MLK Pool should be completed by early June, just in time for summer fun and fitness. Special thanks to our colleagues at Public Works for excellence in project management and an eye for safety and accessibility improvements for the aquatic facility. Our Silverado Pool has been successfully absorbing the community programming for swimming and water safety while the MLK Pool has been closed for renovation work.
7. The Recreation Bandshell, a.k.a. as The Shell, will host the High School Battle of the Bands on Saturday, May 24, 2025, to kick off an impressive run of performances for the Summer of 2025. Shakespeare by the Sea, returns for its second season with popular performances to begin their travel season in Southern California. Seven Saturdays of Summer will be the centerpiece of celebrating local talent at The Shell.
8. There are so many commemorative celebrations popping up on the community calendar. Of historic, human interest is the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Long Beach Casting Club that will be celebrated in Recreation Park on Saturday, May 17th. This unique facility has helped foster national champions and offered great recreational activities to local casting amateurs and professionals. We are looking forward to joining in their centennial celebration.
9. A super shout out to two dozen of our Community Recreation Services team members for their support of the 2025 Beach Streets Open Streets set to take place in West Long Beach on Saturday, May 10, 2025, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Our CRS focus will be upon Admiral Kidd and Hudson parks with particular attention to the safe cross walk areas for participating community members. Hosted by the City of Long Beach and presented by the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro), Beach Streets embrace the active commuting lifestyle by opening the streets and transforming them into safe, open areas for people to bike, walk and explore their neighborhoods. This year's event will uplift the City's [Westside Promise Initiative](#), a 10-year community investment plan that aligns existing City efforts and leverages partnerships to address current and historic challenges facing West Long Beach.

10. Saturday, May 10<sup>th</sup> is also the annual Harvey Milk Park Equity Plaza honorees event, beginning at 11am. This year, five leaders of the LGBTQ+ community will be recognized with their names being added to the park's wall to honor their contributions towards equity, diversity and inclusion over the years in Long Beach. Honorees include John Garcia and Larry Hebert, Kevin Geary, Dr. Marie Cartier, McKinley Isamu "Isa" Quiroz Rached, and Alexandra Billings. Congratulations to this year's honorees. This special event helps kick off Long Beach Pride Week with the 42<sup>nd</sup> Annual Pride Parade sponsored by the City of Long Beach occurring on Sunday, May 18<sup>th</sup> and the Pride Festival celebrated on Marina Green on May 17<sup>th</sup> & 18<sup>th</sup>. A Friends of Harvey Milk Park will be formed following the event with the purpose of expanding awareness of the park's purpose along with organizing positive activation of the park while encouraging supportive "Friends".
11. Memorial Day holiday will be celebrated by the City of Long Beach on Monday, May 26, 2025. The holiday traditionally represents the start of the summer season in Long Beach. The ten weeks of Summer Fun as presented by our Community Recreation Services team will kick off on June 16<sup>th</sup> and run through August 22, 2025. The summer season also sees the pair of popular WiBit floating playgrounds pop up on the waterfront. The Summer of 2025 promises to be another season to remember. # THRONE RESTROOM PILOT PROJECT TESTS PORTABLE RESTROOMS IN PARK LOCATIONS

**Parks, Recreation and Marine is participating in a four-month pilot to provide higher quality, portable public**



restrooms for a limited number of high-demand locations.

The City Technology and Innovation Department proposed the Throne Smart restrooms as a way to provide park users with accessible, high-quality, and safe restrooms.

Thrones were installed at Harvey Milk Park, DeForest Park, Belmont Veterans Memorial Pier and near Shoreline Marina.

The Throne program offers solar-powered units, flexibility in scheduling of maintenance cleaning depending on the usage, and a user-friendly, QR Code access for managing and evaluating performance.

During the pilot, Throne staff will measure the performance of tech-enabled, data-driven restrooms to improve restroom usage, satisfaction, cleanliness, and perceptions of safety.

The staff will work to understand the cost-effectiveness, scalability, and operational needs of smart restrooms as compared to traditional restrooms.

# PARKS, RECREATION & MARINE (PRM) STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

## **PRM's Marine Bureau completed projects that furthered goals of the PRM Strategic Plan to provide safe, accessible**

public spaces and a sustainable park ecosystem. The Plan, approved by the Long Beach City Council in 2022, is guiding operational decisions through 2033 and helps to adapt park services as community needs evolve. The Marine Maintenance Division repaired sections of Dock 10 in Shoreline Marina to make the dock safe and useable for public mooring and free vessel pump out services.

Staff built a roof at Shoreline Marina Dock-6 and added a locking system to the trash enclosure to make the enclosure safe for permitted use.

Marine Maintenance installed new solar panels on the Marine Stadium Landscape Maintenance facility to help achieve net neutral carbon emissions.

A new sewer pump-out system was installed in Basin 2 at Alamitos Bay to ensure a clean and environmentally safe pump out process for Marina customers.

The Beach Maintenance Grounds Division's Lawn to Garden program done in partnership with Long Beach Utilities, the Surfrider Foundation, and ECO Design at Alamitos Bay's have transformed non-recreational turf areas into beautiful native landscapes. The projects restore healthy watersheds using contoured landscapes that direct water back into the ground instead of storm drains.

Advanced irrigation controllers are being installed at Rainbow Harbor, Marina Green, Rainbow Lagoon, and South Waterfront. These controllers enhance water conservation efforts by detecting irrigation system leaks, alerting maintenance teams to issues in real time, and automatically adjusting water usage during rainfall.



The Ocean Core trash can replacement initiative strategically placed 320 new units across beaches, inner bays, parking lots, and Rainbow Harbor docks. These innovative receptacles are composed of 40% post-consumer recycled material and 10% ocean-bound plastic, supporting sustainable waste management and marine conservation.

Marine Operations furthered the goal of partnerships by teaming with the Aquarium of the Pacific Volunteers group to capture and catalogue marine debris caught with the new trash skimming technology that was procured this past year. The group is also setting up tabling at the collection events in Rainbow Harbor to interact with the community and teach them about the marine debris issue.
