Parks, Recreation, Marine and Animal Care Services November 2024 Highlights

1. October came to a fun close with Halloween programs throughout our park system with "Trunk or Treat" events at our community centers with youth and seniors catching the spirit of the holiday. Our Employee Recreation Committee hosted a great Halloween Potluck Luncheon and Costume Contest that brought out the creativity and culinary delights from our Parks, Recreation, Marine and Animal Care Services team. Following Halloween, the City's celebration of Dia De Los Muertos Parade and Arts Festival downtown on Pine Avenue and onto Marina Green on Saturday, November 2nd saw a tremendous turnout for the parade.
2. The El Dorado Nature Center will be offering its popular Annual California Native Plant Sale November 5 – 26 on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays, 10 am – 1pm or while supplies last. Enhance your garden, patio or balcony, while increasing habitat for wildlife. Select from hundreds of beautiful and beneficial California native plants. For more information, call (562) 570-1745.
3. The new Scherer Park Vision Plan is scheduled to be on the Long Beach City Council meeting agenda for Tuesday, November 19, 2024. The Vision Plan was presented and supported by the Parks and Recreation Commission earlier this year following extensive community outreach and engagement. As District 8 Councilman Al Austin heads into the final weeks of the conclusion of his 12 years of leadership and service as a Long Beach Councilmember, the Scherer Park Vision Plan, coupled with the ribbon cutting celebration of Davenport Park on Tuesday, November 12th, are great examples of the effectiveness of his advocacy and support of parks and open space in Council District 8. The Davenport Park ribbon cutting event is scheduled for 1pm on November 12th at 2910 E. 55th Way, Long Beach.
4. IMPORTANT SPECIAL EVENT REMINDER: Thursday, November 21, 2024, at 10am, our Parks, Recreation, Marine and Animal Care Services team will pause to gather in Good Neighbor Park at the Department's Memorial Tree to read the names of those co-workers, past and present, who have passed away. With a Department-wide team that can exceed 1,000 individuals at the peak of summer season, coupled with the realization that hundreds of team members have lengthy terms of service, it seems like an unfortunate occurrence that we find ourselves mourning the passing of a co-worker. Along with immediate family members, whose deaths also create great sadness and emotional challenges for our Department family.

This annual event has proven to be an important moment of additional healing and at times, closure to the range of emotions related to the passing of someone close.

5. While some in the community may feel like our Marine Bureau team is rushing the holiday season, the truth being known is that we are installing the popular local holiday tradition of Trees on the Bay throughout our waterways, lakes, and parks this month. Introduced this year, are ten solar-powered, LED illuminated trees in the Colorado Lagoon. The 68 floating iconic holiday trees will be lighted the night of Thanksgiving.
6. Still pending is a final announcement for the long-awaited dedication of the Junipero Beach Sports Courts. Unfortunately, some important finishing details within the project contractor's work were not completed in time for a previously scheduled ribbon cutting, that event was postponed to a date and time to be determined, most likely in the early part of the new year. The project brings a new basketball court and roller skating plaza to this popular beachfront active recreational area.
7. Pickleball continues to grow in popularity across Long Beach and our facilities are becoming heavily patronized. A request for proposals (RFP) for management of the El Dorado Tennis Center and the Billie Jean King Tennis Center will transition the operations of both facilities to tennis and pickleball centers. Joining the popular dedicated pickleball courts in DeForest Park and Veterans Park will be the addition of dedicated pickleball courts in Silverado Park.

VOLUNTEERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE 40TH ANNUAL CALIFORNIA COASTAL CLEANUP DAY



Long Beach Parks, Recreation and Marine (LBPRM) hosted nearly 1,700 volunteers who made a positive impact

on the local environment at the 40th Annual California Coastal Cleanup Day on Saturday, September 21.

LBPRM provided educational materials to inform the public about marine debris issues and inspire local environmental stewardship.

The group removed more than 3,300 pounds of trash in just three hours at Junipero Beach, Belmont Pier, the Peninsula between 72nd Place and Ocean Blvd., Mother's Beach and the Seal Beach Yacht Club. Site Captains Aquarium of the Pacific, Los Angeles Waterkeeper, Algalita, Seal Beach Yacht Club and the El Dorado Nature Center provided support to the volunteers.

October will be another very engaging month with a bounty of autumn events and fall fun! As we already see many of our parks' deciduous trees turning colors, the cooler temperatures

are a clear reminder of the change of seasons in Long Beach. With Halloween landing on a school night of Thursday, our department will have a variety of 'trunk or treat' style events at many of our community centers during the last week of the month. Another creative collaboration that has become a cool holiday tradition is the Howl-o-ween Festival celebration at the El Dorado Nature Center and the Long Beach Animal Care Services campus next door on Saturday, October 19th. The exciting new vision plan for Martin Luther King Jr. Park that was approved by the Parks and Recreation Commission earlier this year, will be presented for support to the Long Beach City Council on Tuesday, October 15, 2024. The community engagement and outreach coordinated by our Park Planning and Partnerships Bureau team with consultant support by City Fabrick became the basis for the updated master plan for this beloved park

named after the famed civil rights champion. Hundreds of neighbors to the park participated in the process to share their voices and ideas for a park to better meet their active and passive recreational needs and desires.

The long-awaited opening of the new sports courts and skating area at Junipero Beach was set for a ribbon-cutting celebration on Saturday, September 14, 2024, but was unfortunately postponed to a new date and time yet to be determined, likely in the month of December. A new full court for basketball and a special designed roller skating space will expand the fun factor and recreational value of this popular beachfront spot. The project marks another great collaborative effort between our Department and the Public Works Department.

Out on the beautiful beachfront of Long Beach, we will be celebrating the 20th Anniversary of The Lone Sailor on Sunday, October 13 at 11 a.m. A replica of The Lone Sailor was dedicated on December 11, 2004. The statue is prominently displayed in Bluff Park at Ocean Boulevard and Paloma Avenue, overlooking Long Beach Harbor. The Long Beach statue honors all of the men and women who served in the Navy and it pays tribute to all military personnel who were brought across the country by each of the military branches to make Long Beach their home. Partners of Parks organized the celebratory event marking two decades of ongoing community support through the Brick Project that raised funds for the surrounding memorial site. The 7-foot high, 2-piece, cast bronze sculpture, modeled on Petty Officer 1st Class Dan Maloney, was created by Stanley Bleifeld.

October is the first month of our City's fiscal year budget for 2025, and our department continues to be grateful to Long Beach City Council for its financial support of the Parks, Recreation, Marine and Animal Care Services team and all of the programs, special events, and facilities. Our team continues to be dedicated to working diligently every day to deliver clean, safe, welcoming and beautiful parks, beaches, and recreational areas for the community to enjoy. Plant sale patrons can expect an easy shopping experience by completing the following steps:

- Download the Plant Sale Order Form from the PRM website, or fill one out the day of the sale.
- Complete the form by checking the type and quantity of plants you'd like to purchase and turn it in at the Plant Sale area inside the Nature Center's main gate.

- Bring acceptable payment (cash, checks or credit cards) to the pickup.
- After payment, drive to the designated order fulfillment line to pick up plants.
- Enjoy gardening!

Plant quantities are limited, and certain plants may be sold out at time of purchase. Pre-orders are not available, and the items chosen on one's plant order form is distributed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Proceeds from the California Native Plant Sale will benefit Friends of El Dorado Nature Center, an affiliate of the non-profit Partners of Parks, a group that works to cultivate respect, understanding and stewardship of the natural world.

NEW WATER DEBRIS-COLLECTING DEVICE JELLYFISHBOT DEBUT

Long Beach Parks, Recreation and Marine (PRM) has begun using a Jellyfishbot, a remotely controlled debris-collecting device that can remove up to 100 pounds of debris from surface-level water in a single mission.



it to maneuver into hard-to-reach areas. The robot will be used as part of the Marine Bureau's weekly operations, as well as after storm events where an influx of debris is traditionally seen.

To celebrate the debut of the Jellyfishbot, the PRM Adopt a Beach Program, in partnership with the Aquarium of

This device allows Marine Bureau staff to efficiently remove small water debris that would otherwise require a boat and additional staffing to drive and net the debris manually. With the Jellyfishbot, one staff member can both remotely operate the device and remove debris. Additionally, the size of the device allows

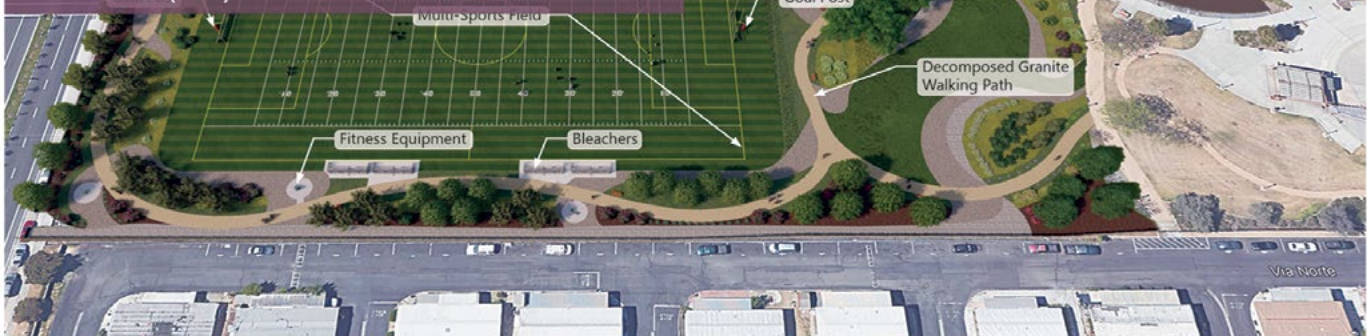

PARKS, RECREATION & MARINE STRATEGIC PLAN ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Parks, Recreation and Marine's Strategic Plan is guiding operational, staffing and budget decisions through 2032.

The plan is a tool to adapt park services as the community's needs evolve.



The last quarter from July to September 2024 was a significant time for the Community Recreation Services Bureau as they delivered important, enriching programs during the summer to serve Long Beach residents.

Goal 1: PROVIDE SAFE ACCESSIBLE PUBLIC SPACES

In August, PRM was the beneficiary of \$8,800 from the Mayor's Fund to cover the cost of an additional Day Camp and provide scholarships for youth sports leagues and swimming lessons. These funds support this goal by expanding scholarships to subsidize fee programs for income-qualified participants

Goal 2: MEANINGFUL PROGRAMMING

Summer Day Camps for ages 5-12 were offered at 8 parks and two waterfront locations. Nearly 4,000 camp attendance visits occurred during the 10-week program, reflecting a 6 percent increase at the same sites from 2023. Summer camp programs further Goal 2's desired outcome to increase programming at parks in North, West, and Central Long Beach and increase programs that allow youth to access the beach, ocean and water-related activities.

The Teen Volunteer Program furthered Goal 2 with increased community-based and industry aligned career development opportunities and work-based learning classes to youth. A total of 143 teens providing nearly 10,800 volunteer hours to support summer programming. This includes an increase in 70 more volunteers and 3,000 additional hours from last summer. A total of 19 teen volunteers were hired in the last year.

The Long Beach Recovery (LBRA) Act-funded Virtual Recreation program supported Goal 2 by developing virtual park programming made available online in real time and in recorded programming, creating spaces and opportunities for culturally specific programming focusing on Black, Latinx, Southeast Asian, and other historically marginalized groups. A total of 16 new videos and shorts were created, and 27 videos are available on the PRM YouTube Channel in languages other than English.

The LBRA-funded Mobile Recess program furthers the achievement of Goal 2 by bringing recreation to neigh-

borhoods that do not have access to parks or programs. Four more sites were added this summer and the Long Beach City Council approved funding for another year.

Neighbor-to-Neighbor Community Events funded by the State of California, Governor's Office of Planning and Research and done in partnership with City Fabrick and the Office of Sustainability increased programming at parks in North, West, and Central Long Beach. Events were held at Silverado, McBride and Admiral Kidd in July and August and provided opportunities for residents to connect and receive information about PRM and city resources.

The Jellyfishbot naming and art contest was promoted to build awareness of PRM's latest trash collection device and introduce new environmental stewardship and experiential learning programs aimed at learning about the environment and protecting open space.

Goal 6: SUSTAINABLE PARK ECOSYSTEM

To celebrate the debut of the Jellyfishbot, a new trash collecting device, the PRM Adopt a Beach Program, in partnership with the Aquarium of the Pacific and supported by sponsors Long Beach Container Terminal and Intex Recreation Corporation, invited youth to name and create art for the device. The chosen artist will receive a \$1,500 scholarship package, and other prizes donated by sponsors. This contest is an engaging way to connect with schools, libraries, nonprofits, businesses and organizations to expand programming offered by the PRM Department.

The 40th annual California Coastal Cleanup Day was held on September 21. The event supported Goal 6 objectives to increase park clean-up volunteer opportunities and keep the beach and marinas clean of debris, and to help maximize activation and tourism. El Dorado Nature Center hosted five sites where nearly 1700 volunteers removed more than 3,300 lbs. of trash on our beaches.

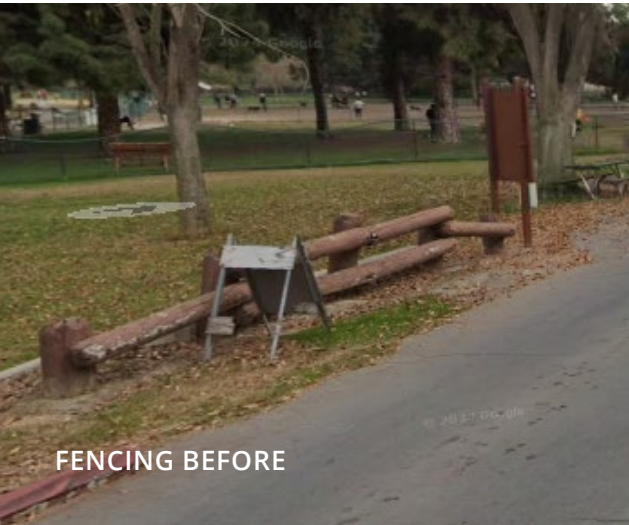


Goal 7: ENSURE A DIVERSE AND DYNAMIC WORKFORCE
