**RECOMMENDATION:**

Recommendation to adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or designee, to execute a contract, and any necessary documents including any necessary subsequent amendments, with Multiquip Inc., of Cypress, CA, for the purchase of a Multiquip mobile generator and trailer with related equipment and accessories, on the same terms and conditions afforded to Sourcewell (Contract No. RFP #020923-MTQ), in a total amount not to exceed \$22,207, inclusive of taxes and fees. (Citywide)

**DISCUSSION**

City Council approval is requested to enter into a contract with Multiquip Inc. for the purchase and delivery of a Multiquip model DCA15SPX4F mobile generator and trailer for use by the Public Works Department, Public Services Bureau, Traffic and Signals Division. The Public Services Bureau, Traffic and Signals Division maintains the City of Long Beach's (City) street signs; upkeeps the 3,600 parking meters on streets and in surface lots, street striping and legends of red, green, white, and blue curbs; and keeps the City's 550 traffic signals operating 24 hours a day. The proposed unit would replace a unit that is 23 years old and has been retired due to the end of its useful life.

No Long Beach-based businesses manufacture or sell this equipment. The Fleet Services Bureau of the Financial Management Department researched procurement options for the purchase of mobile generators and trailers and discovered other agencies had completed an open, fair, transparent, and competitive procurement process. The City reviewed the cooperative agreement options and determined that the contract between Sourcewell and Multiquip Inc. provided the best value to the City.

Multiquip Inc. was selected based on their competitive pricing, best overall quality, and selection of equipment/product offerings to meet the needs of cooperative members and other governmental authorities. All Sourcewell contracts are competitively bid and offer the best available pricing. Sourcewell is a State of Minnesota local government agency and service cooperative created under the laws of the State of Minnesota (Minnesota Statutes Section 123A.21) that offers cooperative procurement solutions to its members.

City Charter Section 1802 provides an alternative procurement method by permitting the City to purchase or otherwise obtain services, supplies, materials, equipment, and labor using existing contracts from other governmental agencies. This alternative procurement method can save time and reduce costs through economies of scale by purchasing under existing contracts from other

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government agencies on a voluntary and selective basis when authorized by a Resolution adopted by the City Council.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Ashleigh Stone and Revenue Management Officer Geraldine Alejo on December 4, 2024, and by Purchasing Agent Michelle Wilson on November 27, 2024.

### SUSTAINABILITY

Fleet Services researched alternative fueled and zero-emission options and determined no viable lower-emission alternatives currently available on the market. The generator has a tier-4 diesel engine with advanced emissions controls, certified by the California Air Resources Board, which significantly reduces greenhouse gas, nitrous oxide, and particulate emissions. The generator is fully compliant with the State of California and local air quality emission standards and will be utilizing renewable diesel fuel in City service.

### TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action to adopt a Resolution and award a contract concurrently is requested on January 7, 2025, to ensure that a contract is in place expeditiously.

### FISCAL IMPACT

The total amount of the contract will not exceed \$22,207, inclusive of taxes and fees. This purchase is budgeted in the General Fund Group in the Public Works Department. Ongoing annual maintenance, fuel, and replacement costs for this unit are estimated at \$6,297 and will be charged to the General Fund Group in the Public Works Department through the Fleet Services Bureau's Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) billing process. This recommendation has no staffing impact beyond the normal budgeted scope of duties and is consistent with current City Council priorities. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH MULTIQUIP, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE AND DELIVERY OF A MULTIQUIP MOBILE GENERATOR AND TRAILER, WITH RELATED EQUIPMENT AND ACCESSORIES, ON THE SAME TERMS AND CONDITIONS AFFORDED TO SOURCEWELL, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$22,207, INCLUDING TAXES AND FEES

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Long Beach (the “City”), Section 1802, permits the City to purchase services, supplies, materials, equipment and labor with other government agencies by purchasing under their contracts on a voluntary and selective basis when authorized by resolution; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to purchase a Multiquip mobile generator and trailer, with related equipment and accessories, for use by the Department of Public Works, Public Services Bureau, Traffic and Signals Division; and

WHEREAS, the Public Services Bureau, Traffic and Signals Division maintains the City of Long Beach’s street signs, upkeeps the 3,600 parking meters on streets and in surface lots, street striping and legends of red, green, white, and blue curbs, and keeps the City’s 550 traffic signals operating 24 hours a day. The proposed unit is replacing a unit that is 23 years old and has been retired due to the end of its useful life; and

WHEREAS, the Fleet Services Bureau of the Financial Management Department researched procurement options for the purchase of a Multiquip mobile generator and trailer, with related equipment and accessories and discovered other

3 WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach reviewed the cooperative agreement  
4 options and determined that the contract between Sourcewell, a State of Minnesota local  
5 government agency and service cooperative created under the laws of the State of  
6 Minnesota (“Sourcewell”) and Multiquip, Inc. provided the best value to the City; and

7 WHEREAS, Multiquip, Inc., was selected based on their competitive pricing,  
8 best overall quality, and selection of equipment/product offerings to meet the needs of  
9 cooperative members and other governmental authorities; and

10 WHEREAS, Sourcewell has a contract for the purchase of a Multiquip mobile  
11 generator and trailer, with related equipment and accessories, Contract No. RFP #020923-  
12 MTQ (“Sourcewell Contract”); and

13 WHEREAS, the City’s participation in the Sourcewell Contract will facilitate  
14 the City’s ability to purchase the Multiquip mobile generator and trailer, with related  
15 equipment and accessories as well as provide considerable cost benefits to the City; and

16 WHEREAS, if the City had to utilize a formal bid process rather than  
17 participate in the Sourcewell Contract considerably more funds would be required;

18 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as  
19 follows:

20 Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated  
21 herein by this reference.

22 Section 2. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to enter an  
23 agreement with Multiquip, Inc., for the purchase and delivery of a Multiquip mobile  
24 generator and trailer, with related equipment and accessories of the same type and kind  
25 identified in the Sourcewell Contract except as modified by mutual agreement of the City  
26 and Multiquip, Inc., and the purchase by the City shall be on the same terms and conditions  
27 afforded to Sourcewell in an amount not to exceed Twenty-Two Thousand Two Hundred  
28 Seven Dollars (\$22,207), including taxes and fees.
